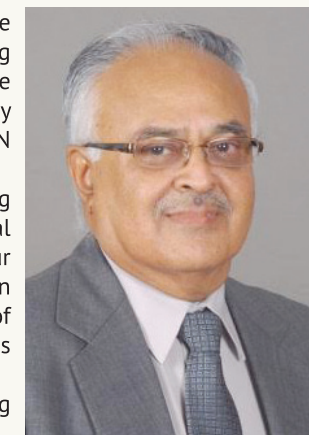

is a young, dynamic and thorough professional with a down-to-earth approach. After graduating in Management of Industrial Relations and Computer Application Systems from University of Bridgeport, he worked in Italy, Canada and US donning senior management roles. Later, he did his Masters in Business Administration from Babson College, F.W.Olin Graduate School of Business, Wellesley. Presently, the Executive Director of Womens Center, Jayaram is unconventional in his thinking and approach. In this interview, he talks at length about Womens Center and the strategies involved in taking the Center to greater glory.

Excerpts:



the next 5 years and what strategies are you employing to achieve them?

The next five years are going to focus on the consolidation of the hub centers and creating some spokes for them. We'll be actively reaching out to physicians who want to do the right thing for such patients but don't know where to send them. There are many areas in Southern India where people don't have access to higher levels of care and don't know where to go to get it if they require it.

Can you brief us about your infrastructural facilities - at Coimbatore, Trichy, Salem and Chennai?

Coimbatore has by far the most comprehensive women and new born facility in India - it's been recognized 2 years in a row as the best comprehensive women's healthcare provider for South India. All facilities for deliveries including jacuzzis for patients in labor and painless delivery are included. From a gynaecology stand point there're technologies such as MRgFUS that eliminate the need for traditional surgery. For those requiring surgery most of our surgeries are done through 3D laparoscopy instead of the regular 2D. This increases speed, efficiency and accuracy of the surgeon leading to lower rates of complications and quicker recovery from surgery. Our state of the art NICU for new born babies has sent home babies born at 27 weeks and with weights under 800 grams. The building has been built

to ensure plenty of natural lighting with materials and paints used that reduce the VOCs in the atmosphere. Trichy, Chennai and Salem are fertility units only and do not practice any of the other branches of OBG. This ensures that we do not have a conflict of interest with our referring doctors who're looking for ethical places to send their patients to. The Chennai center has been recently re-opened in T-Nagar in conjunction with the Mehta Hospitals, an 80+ year old brand in Chennai.

Are there any other exciting business

plans in the pipeline?

Within the last 18 months, we have brought in SCSA, sperm DNA testing to India from the USA. We're in the process of tying up with a Spanish organization to bring in Next Generation Sequencing (NGS) for embryos to India.

Don't Fall Flat Before Fat Walk Back Into Life

Like Jayalakshmi

It is true she'd to endure a lot of physical pain. But, in many cases, it's the damage it inflicts on one's psyche that counts more as people with funny gait often become the objects of ridicule

For 76-year-old Mrs. Jayalakshmi Sowrirajan, a native of Dindigal, life had become an unbearable torture after an abnormal amount of fat started accumulating in the lower thighs, legs and inner sides of both her knee joints.

Jayalakshmi was otherwise a healthy lady as she had not undergone any major surgeries in the past or suffered from any major ailments. Though she was under medication for hypertension, she was not a diabetic.

You might wonder: What is the big deal if an abnormal amount of fat gets accumulated as in the case of Jayalakshmi? In simple words, we can tell you a medical condition of this kind can have devastating effects on both the physique and psyche.

Yes, the abnormality disturbed the way Jayalakshmi walked as she had to keep her legs apart since she found it very difficult to bring them together. As her gait changed, she also developed severe pain in hip, knees, joints and ankle.

"It is true she'd to endure a lot of physical pain. But, in many cases, it's the damage it inflicts on one's psyche that counts more as people with funny gait often become the objects of ridicule," says plastic and cosmetic surgeon Dr. R. Gunasekaran.

In the initial days Jayalakshmi found relief in pain killers, although temporary, but as it happens in some cases, she very soon started developing side effects. This being so, she hastened to consult an orthopaedician.

"The doctor advised me to remove the fat accumulation through an open surgical procedure to normalise my walking pattern. But, as I'm old, I was averse to the idea of going under knife," Jayalakshmi recalls.

It was thus she reached Womens Center. "I wanted to explore other ways. I was looking for a cost-effective cure involving less pain. For, I was scared of the pain, the post-surgical scar and anaesthesia," she says. The doctors who examined her at Womens Center found a huge, abnormal fat accumulation involving the inner sides of both the knee joints which was hanging loose and long.

Besides redundant skin with lumpiness over thigh and abdomen, she also had varicose veins in the thighs and legs and the skin below the middle of both the legs had undergone discolorization.

"We found that, clinically, her other health parameters were normal. But, the condition had altered her gait (walking pattern) completely. So, we discussed the treatment options available before us thoroughly," says Dr. Gunasekaran.

There were two options: (a) liposuction (b) open procedure. Jayalakshmi, however, opted for the first as it involves less pain, limited hospital stay, early recovery and negligible post-procedure scar.

After doing routine blood investigations and obtaining the opinion of cardiologist, the procedure was discussed in a meeting chaired by director, plastic surgeon, anaesthetist, physiotherapist, nursing in-charge and physician.

"We admitted her a day

before the procedure as her blood pressure was high due to anxiety and performed liposuction through wet

technique with a stab incision using specialised instruments," explains Dr. Gunasekaran.

The medical team aspirated about 1000 ml from right side and 900 ml from left side and stab incision was closed. Jayalakshmi was given pain killers and custom-made sucking and was ambulated upon recovery from anaesthesia and she recovered well.

She is now able to walk freely without any discomfort. "Now, I don't feel

any pain in hip, joints, knees or ankle. The main relief is that my walking pattern has once again become normal," says a beaming Jayalakshmi.

Excessive fat accumulation could severely restrict one's free movements. But, it is not necessary that every patient facing such a problem should go under knife. "Liposuction is a great option. And, we do it with expertise," affirms Dr. Gunasekaran.

NOW, YOU GET LOAN TO TREAT FERTILITY ISSUES

Are you a childless couple? Has it been diagnosed that you have a fertility-related problem? Has your doctor told you that there is a fair and reasonable chance of begetting a child by medically fixing the problem? But, is lack of funds holding you back from exploring this option?

Then, smile! Womens Center has tied up with Bajaj Finance Limited which extends care credit

under its Lifestyle Finance portfolio. In other words, it means couples now have the option to avail hassle-free loan, payable in easy installments to undergo fertility treatment.

Womens Center gets patients from different categories. Sometimes some couples seeking fertility treatment postpone the decision due to lack of funds. It's here the loan option becomes both helpful and relevant.

Who's eligible?

Eligibility and the loan amount to be sanctioned would largely depend on the profile of the customer. However, broadly speaking, salaried, self-employed professionals, non-professionals and pensioners can avail the care credit.

A person who wants to avail this loan should have attained a minimum age of 23 years. Salaried persons can avail the

loan till they attain the age of 60 years while in the case of professionals, non-professionals and pensioners the age criteria stands extended by another 5 years. In the case of salaried people, minimum age should be 23 while the maximum age should not exceed 60 years.

Repayment Duration:

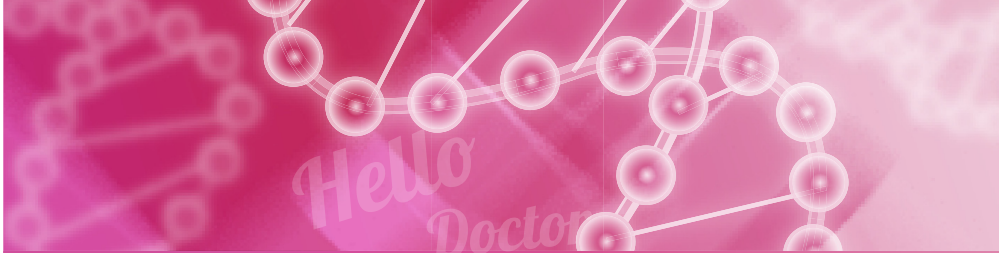
The loan availed could be repaid in 10, 12 or 15 monthly installments. The 10-month repayment option will require an advance payment of 2 EMIs while an advance payment of 4 EMIs should be done for the 12-month option. However, those who opt for the 15-month duration will need to make an advance payment of 5 EMIs. There is also the option of foreclosure of the loan after paying the first EMI.

Q I'm a 14-year-old girl student. I started menstruating at the age of 12. My father is a farmer and mother, housewife. They are not much educated. My problem is that during my menstrual cycles, I bleed a lot and experience severe leg pain. I'm afraid to tell this to my mother. Is it normal? Should I see a doctor? My periods are also not regular. I need your help. Please don't throw this into dustbin.

Answer There can be nothing more important than helping a young lady. When you start having your periods, it takes two to three years for the hormonal system to mature. During this time it is quite normal to have irregular cycles and you need not worry about this. As for the pain and profuse nature of bleeding it will be better if you can consult a gynecologist. It is important to make sure that you do not become anemic. A few simple tests may need to be done to make sure that there are no other underlying problems. Most of the time simple medications can help you to deal with the problem. I would like to encourage you to reach out for help confidently.

Q I'm 25-year-old unmarried woman. During my college days, I had fallen in love with a classmate of mine. However, due to my parents' objections, we could not get married. Out of frustration, once I even tried to commit suicide by consuming poison. This was around 2 years back. After this episode, my classmate got married to some other girl. Now, I want to move on with my life and want to get married. But, some of my friends tell me that the poison I consumed during suicide attempt may have damaged my uterus. Is it true? In such a case, wouldn't I be able to become pregnant? Should I see a doctor? Should I do some tests? Please advise.

Answer A poison that you apparently took 2 years back, if it did not hurt you, is extremely unlikely to have hurt your ovaries or uterus. I don't believe you need to go through any tests or consultations. Rather than worry about physical problems, you should attempt to develop more self confidence and mental strength, so you don't resort to such responses when you are faced with adversities.



Q I'm a 24-year-old spinner and an IT professional. There is an excess growth of hair on my body, particularly, on face, thighs, below the knee and back. My mother told me to use turmeric while taking bath. I tried doing this but that is not of much use. Is there any other safe method to remove the unwanted hair growth? My parents want me to get married soon. But, I'm bit scared and embarrassed. Can you advise me appropriately, doctor?

Answer Excessive hair growth in many cases may be just familial, in other words, it may be inherited. However in some instances it may be the mark of hormonal imbalance. It will be wise to be checked for the hormonal problems which can be corrected with medical treatment. For getting rid of the hair which are already there, do not use a razor. There are better and more permanent methods available such as laser. This definitely does not have to be a major problem adversely affecting your future relationships or life in general.



Q I'm 30-year-old married woman. I got married 5 years back. During these 5 years, I conceived thrice but they all ended in miscarriages. The doctor I consulted said in some cases it happens. Is it really so? Can I have a successful pregnancy? Is there a need for me to see a doctor? I am desperately looking for an answer, because, I have been consciously trying not to get pregnant after the three failed attempts. Please help.

Answer A single miscarriage for a couple is not an uncommon event. A large percentage of these events are due to chromosomal abnormalities in the conception itself. It is almost nature's way of making sure that an abnormal pregnancy does not grow. It is unfortunate that well-meaning people, sometimes advise the couple that the event happened because of something that they did or didn't do. This gives the mother such a guilt complex and depression. Unfortunately as it is, it should be made clear to them that it is often an inevitable natural event and does not imply anything for their future. However if it is a recurrent event (especially three or more) the couple should be investigated thoroughly. There are many factors on either side like hormonal problems, uterine problems, ejections and even DNA abnormalities in the sperm which can cause this distressing situation. If investigated and diagnosed, most of these issues can be corrected.

I wish to tell you not to get discouraged and look for a solution. Majority of the couples like you go on to have normal pregnancies and children.



Dogs do a better job in detecting **CANCERS**

The word tsunami rings destruction and devastation. But, not when it is the name of a German shepherd. She looks regal, happily wags her tail and she's very attentive.

Tsunami has already stumped the researchers at the University of Pennsylvania. They certify she is more than 90 per cent successful in identifying the scents of ovarian cancer.

This development has opened a new window on a disease which kills nearly 14,000 Americans a year and has no effective test for early detection.

The researchers started working on the project last year and they are now focused on training dogs using tissue samples for both cancerous ovaries and ovaries with benign disease.

Researchers confirm that three dogs learned to recognise cancerous samples and Tsunami has been particularly successful in her training.

When she is working, Tsunami becomes a quiet, pensive animal. She works slowly, circling a wheel containing blocks of samples. She sniffs, she stops, she thinks!

When she identifies cancer,

she sits; that's the sign. She is very serious about it all, say the researchers.

Experts, interestingly, say early detection of ovarian cancer can give a five-year survival rate of over 90 per cent. So, how is it that, canines help in the early detection of cancers?

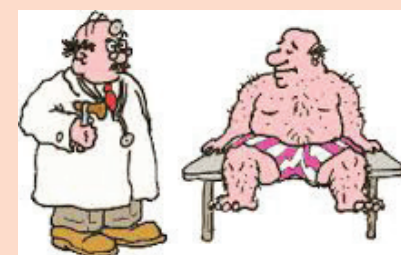
Dogs have long helped on search-and-rescue considering that a canine snout has 220 million olfactory cells compared to 50 million for humans.

A growing body of evidence now supports the possible use of canines by clinicians. Researchers have also found that dogs can detect prostate cancer by smelling urine samples with 98 per cent accuracy.

So, how does a dog sniff out cancer? Experts say dogs actually detect the chemicals known as volatile organic compound (VOC) emitted by a tumor.

There is no denying the fact that dogs can sniff out a range of illnesses. But, can they be used on a large-scale basis? It is a million dollar question.

Meanwhile, the debate rages: Which one detects a cancer better? A laboratory or Labrador?

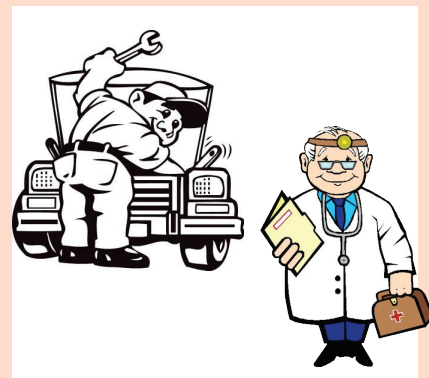
